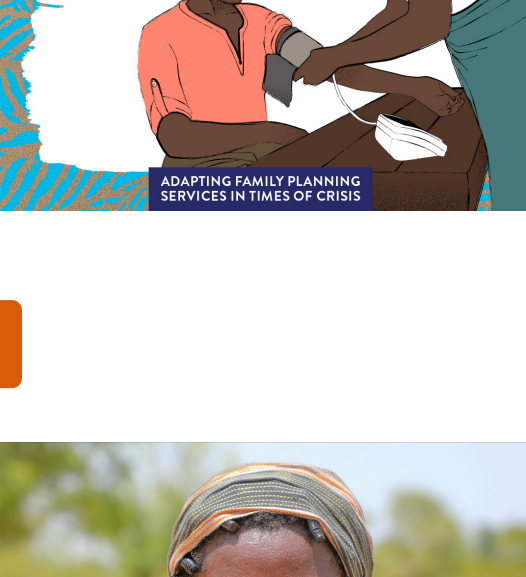

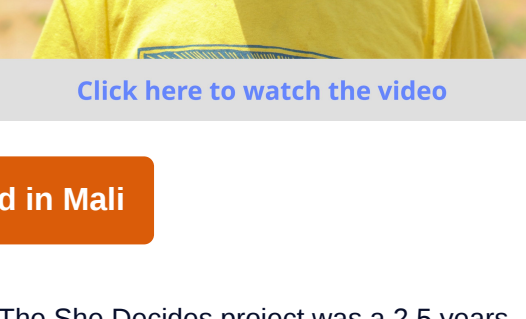

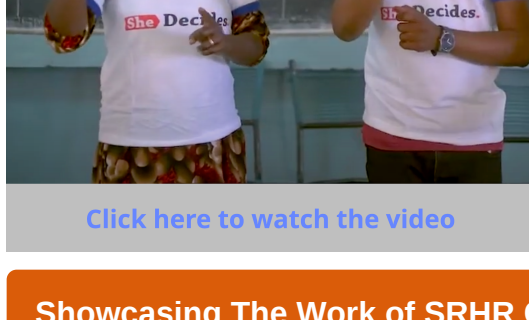
Taking Action in Humanitarian Crises

In partnership with the **German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ)** and three IPPF Member Associations (**Togo, Burkina Faso and Cameroon**), IPPF provided SRHR care services and support on income generating activities to **317 000 people** affected by humanitarian crises in Sub-Saharan Africa. These include refugees, internally displaced persons and host communities.

Showcasing The Work of SRHR Champion Kenya's King of Condoms

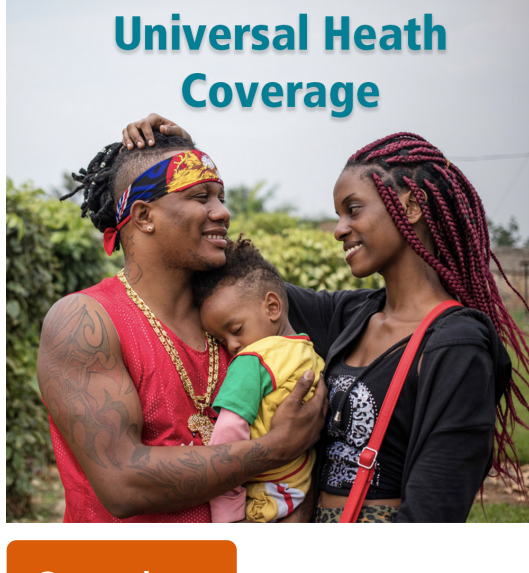

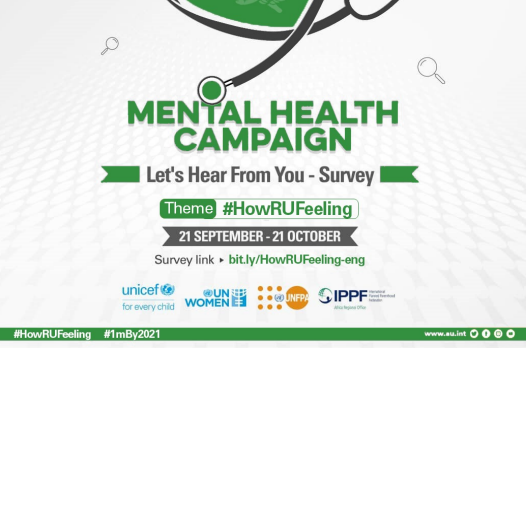


World Sexual Health Day

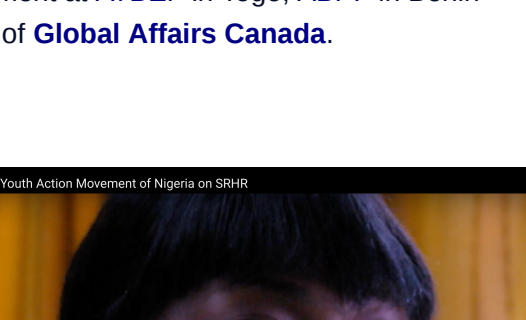

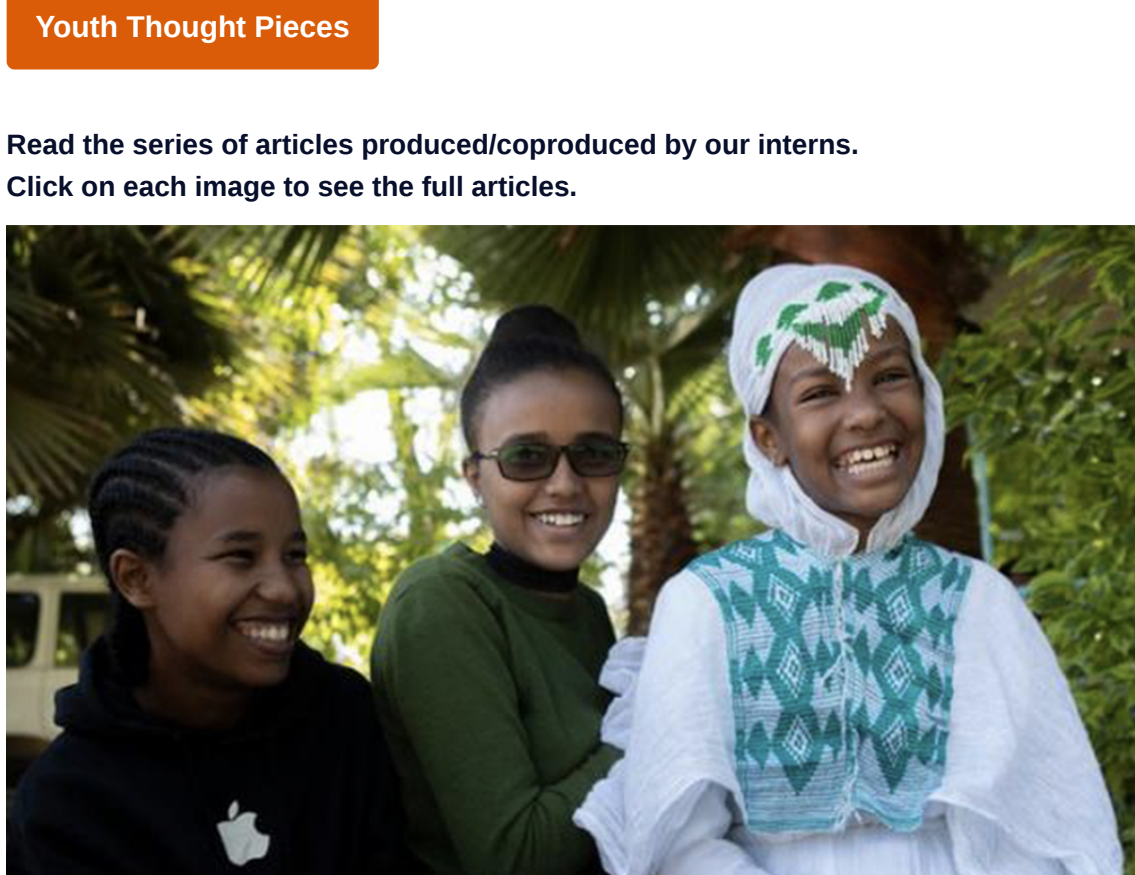
Nigeria YAM Members Engaging With A Famous Influencer

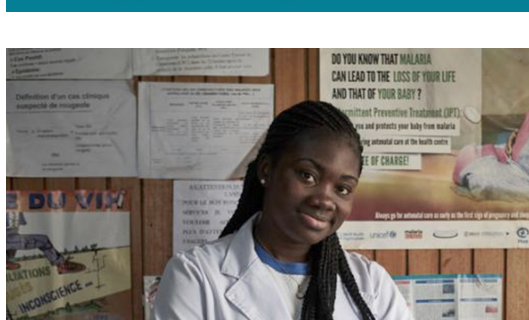

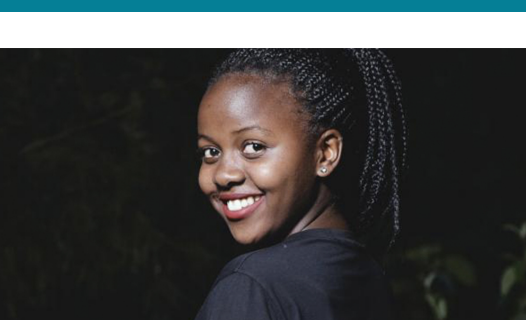
